I'm delighted to at last bring some brilliant news for our village. The Parish Council is more than happy to announce ten people have put their names forward and volunteered to be on the "Neighbourhood Plan" Working Party, along with two Parish Councillors, Betty Tyson and Guy Redfern.

I would like to wish a warm welcome and a big thank you to all the twelve people who have offered their professional skills and valuable time to serve on the Working Party. It's worth noting that in addition to these twelve, many others have offered to assist the group with any assistance they might need going forward. I would also like to say that Huby are one of only a few communities in the country to be given "front runner status". In excess of £20,000 is available straight away

to assist in developing the "NHP" in moving things forward as fast as possible. The "NHP" was featured the other weekend on BBC1s breakfast show. The "NHP" is backed by the government, and Hambleton District Council.

The Working Party is a democratically elected group, who will be open and transparent as they move forward. They will report progress to the Parish Council, who will in turn keep the entire village updated. During this process there will be plenty of opportunity for the residents to get involved, and offer any ideas they might have that will benefit the village.

Some of the key areas the group will be looking at are the facilities the village needs to move forwards in the 21st century. Things such as:

Super fast broadband -Housing-Sports Hall-Village Memorial Hall-School-Play Ground etc. This will of course require grants and where necessary fund raising. What should the priorities be, and where and how big such facilities need to be .

In my view, if the entire village work together this can and will be achieved in quick time. Many grants and funds have sadly been missed, but many more are available. Huby will not miss out any more.

Thank you, and do remember to visit the Parish Council website to attend future meetings. The more the merrier and the stronger we will be. One loud voice speaks volumes. Roll on Spring and Summer. Best Wishes to all

Changes to your Council Tax

Currently the government seems to be changing its mind as fast as it changes its socks but it falls to me to try and explain the variances you may note in your Council Tax bill. Basically you should see very little difference in the `bottom line` from last year but the aficionados may well look for differences in the calculations.

You will appreciate that HDC collect the tax due for NYCC, NY Police and NY Fire and Rescue over which they have no control. They also collect the Parish

Council precepts and the District Council tax, all in one invoice.

Government has decreed that they wish to replace any Council Tax Benefit with a Council Tax Discount which will have the effect of reducing the number of households in the village who pay any Council Tax. This of course means that the number of households in the village who pay the parish council precept goes down and hence the actual amount per household goes up. Recognising this

the Govt/HDC have given a grant to Huby parish of £427 which when applied to individual Council Tax bands will bring the invoice total very similar to last year. Phew!

But don't count on it for next year. The provisional figures for 2014-15 suggest further massive reductions in Government funding with a consequent reduction in services or an increase in the Council Tax you are asked to pay.
